SUPPORT FOR FAMILIES IN CRISIS

This year, Friend Daniel supported a single parent family experiencing compounding set backs. His work prevented child Mike* and his brother from being placed into foster care.



Daniel and Program Director, David, arranged for the children to stay with a family member while their father received mental health treatment. They also supported the children in getting to school, helped the family through an apartment fire, filled food, clothing and supply needs, and assisted with unexpected car repairs. The family's case worker recognized the support of Friends of the Children in keeping this family together.

YOU ARE MY PERSON

Friend Haley works with Jodi* whose trauma early in life makes it hard for her to regulate her emotions. After a particularly strong outburst on an outing, Haley learned Jodi's caregiver had been incarcerated.



Because of their strong relationship, Haley is able to provide a safe space for Jodi to work through her anger. Haley now has been given access to connect with Jodi's therapist to continue working through the calming exercises she learns in therapy. Jodi's school social worker also reaches out when concerns pop up in the classroom, and they feel Jodi could use extra support. Jodi recently shared with Haley, "I'm so glad you're my person."

OUR LONG TERM OUTCOMES

Since Friends of the Children began over 25 years ago, we have been tracking outcomes, and the results are remarkable:



83% of youth graduate high school



92% enroll in post-secondary education, serve our country, or enter the workforce



98% avoid early parenting



93% avoid the juvenile justice system
