



Dear friends of Friends,

As the pandemic wanes, I am reminded that we entered this crisis with underserved families and youth already facing immense challenges related to poverty and inequitable systems. This dual pandemic—and racial unrest—has significantly impacted the youth and families we walk alongside. We have all learned from and supported each other as we moved through a year filled with uncertainty, stops and starts to in-person service, and transitions.

Through it all, we leaned into our core values to Put Children First, Build Relationships on Love, Pursue Goals Relentlessly, Commit to Empowerment, and Demand Equity. We use our values to make informed decisions; hire, coach, and manage; and, most importantly, to change the way the world treats and views our highest-priority youth with a vision of long-term systemic transformation.

Last fall, youth returned to in-person school settings after more than a year of social distancing and isolation while they continued to navigate the compounded effects of complex trauma, both past and current, along with low economic mobility and disproportionate access to resources. Friends focused on priority areas identified by caregivers: supporting children to be successful in the classroom, connections to opportunities that benefit the entire family, teacher communication, and behavioral challenges.

Our belief in the power of 1:1 relationships was exemplified through our Change the Narrative project, where youth collaborate with their Friends to create a biography to share with their teachers and other school staff. These biographies give educators vital information to help build positive and collaborative relationships with our youth focused on their own strengths and what they need to improve success in school.

We also advanced our objectives around diversity, equity, and inclusion by creating a racial equity action plan that includes organization-wide accountabilities and reflects our values. The mental health of both youth and staff remained priorities as we grappled with grief and loss within our community and the broader world around us. Time and time again this year, we witnessed how our proven mentoring model transforms lives. Through unconditional long-term support and love, Friends positively impact the mental health of youth and families and provide support so they may keep moving forward in a world that is increasingly isolating and challenging. We surround youth with a network of caring adults in addition to their assigned Friend to nurture a strong sense of belonging within our community. We want youth to know they are the heroes in their own stories and they are amazing—just the way they



Roadmap Goals focus on intermediate outcomes in five different areas and every quarter, we analyze the progress youth have made in these areas. In 2021:


92% of youth made quarterly progress on their school success goals,

90% of youth made quarterly progress on their plans and skills for the future.







We Meet Youth Where They're At.

A frog in hand, Tic Tac Toe with sticks, parkour jumps from stump to stump, horseback riding, pausing during a walk to stare at a snail - these are just a few of the adventures with Kevin in the outdoors. As Kevin's Friend, I join him during those nature walks weekly, if not in person, at least remotely over video chat.

Kevin likes it when I ask nature or science trivia questions like: What is the smallest bird? What is the largest bird? We read and discuss fun facts like:

- A bee hummingbird is the smallest living bird.
- Hummingbirds can fly backward.
- The ostrich is the largest bird in the world.
 Kevin ponders each trivia question makes
 an educated guess and normally does not skip a
 beat. His therapist and I are profoundly impressed by his knowledge about birds and other

animals and work in tandem to support and nurture this spark. Every week I find new trivia questions to ask him online or in person. He is an animal trivia whiz!

Over the course of those several months working remotely, his therapist brought Kevin to different places, such as parks, horseback riding, and the Portland Audubon Wildlife Sanctuary where care is provided to injured birds. During a Portland Audubon outing, Kevin asks me questions over

video chat to see if I can guess the different bird species. I guess the Spotted Owl and Eagle correctly. However, he stumps me on a species of a particular hawk. Kevin and his therapist send me hints throughout the week, as I stumble with my guesses to identify this mysterious bird. After several text messages and days later, I finally guess it correctly on our next video call. Proudly I tell him, "It's an American Kestrel!"

When not in video chats Kevin and his therapist send photos of birds they discover during their adventures, and I try to guess what it is. Sometimes they send hints or a link where I can research on my own a bit. The three of us share a Spark for nature, animals, and being outdoors - we explore together.

Virtually, over the months when we worked remotely, I went on several walks with Kevin through Portland area parks. In one video chat, Kevin stops to ask if I can hear the call of a bird. He mimics the sound and tells me; it is a chickadee. Kevin stoops down to pick up an insect that he places on his shoulder. He walks with his new beetle friend. We're all in awe as to the length of time the insect stays on his shoulder as he walks until its wings stretch out and it takes flight.

As I've worked with Kevin, he has grown his Spark for nature, science, and now ornithology by leaps and bounds. Now, with the weather warming up and being back in person, we have our sights set on visits to local parks and nature hikes. And who knows, maybe we will spot an American Kestrel in the wild!

A Note from a Longtime Friend

The one constant at FriendsPDX is the unconditional love and support for the youth. I think of the youngsters who have helped foster a safe and nurturing space together, hiked mountains in the gorge for the first time, trusted a non-family member adult and opened up emotionally, advocated for themselves, became more confident in themselves, engaged in tough conversations about race, culture and identity, have put in the work to get to know themselves, cooked a meal from scratch, failed and kept trying, took acting lessons, learned to swim, took snowboarding lessons, kept an open mind and believed in themselves, and so many other exciting moments. The young humans and I have navigated a myriad of situations throughout our years together and as much as I hope that I have made at least a small impact on their lives, I know for a fact they have made an enormous impact on my life. They push me in countless ways, they challenge me in my thinking, they accept me when I make mistakes and they continue to show up. I will be forever grateful to them, and no matter what, we will always be connected. This is my why.











Our model is distinct, courageous and proven.

Chooky and Enrique Fuller-Avalos are siblings born a year and a half apart and raised in Portland, OR. The siblings learned about Friends of the Children—Portland (Friends PDX) when Enrique, fondly nicknamed Buddha, was selected by FriendsPDX in kindergarten. He met with his first Friend, Andy, in 2007. Enrique was in 1st grade.

Chooky recalls being jealous of Enrique having a Friend, but also remembers being recognized and listened to by Andy when he would come by. She shares, "as a kid, it was amazing to have an adult be invested in my wellbeing even though I wasn't their mentee!" The pair remembers bouncing around Portland and having cousins stay with them throughout childhood and that those family members also felt acknowledged and respected by Enrique's Friends.

During a portion of their high school years, their family experienced homelessness. Enrique discloses that he had trouble getting to classes and that his GPA suffered. Even still, his Friend Adam supported him with frequent check-ins and by sharing resources. Enrique explains, "it wasn't just here are some school supplies

are some school supplies, it was here are school supplies and let's study for that French test and let's get you a tutor. FriendsPDX was and still is so important to me because it helped me achieve my goals. Some I didn't even know I had." Regaining confidence was a frequent theme in Enrique's youth.

After "flunking out" of his freshman and sophomore year of high school due to the instability at home, Enrique didn't see college as a viable option despite his hustling during his junior and senior years. He considered trade school and was looking at becoming a police officer, but also saw the benefits of pursuing secondary education. Adam reminded Enrique that "if you want something, don't limit yourself. Chase the dreams that scare you!" He also shared about the Jordan Wings Scholarship that invests in its recipients based on their heart and character, not just academics like many other funders, so Enrique applied. Chooky recalls proofreading his application before he sent it off. Enrique didn't think he was a top contender due to his GPA, so he didn't think much of it. But, at the beginning of 2019, with just months to spare before finishing high school and graduating from the FriendsPDX program, he found out he won the scholarship!

Flash forward to today and Enrique's looking forward to graduating with the Class of 2023 from Western Oregon University. He will receive his bachelor's degree in Political Science with minors in legal studies, homeland security, and data analytics.

Throughout his time in college, he's stayed in touch with all three of his Friends and they have all visited him in Monmouth. Enrique comments how, "Andy always makes sure to reach out," like when he made the President's Honor Roll for the first time in his freshman year. To date, he has a 3.8 GPA and has been recognized on the President's Honor Roll and Dean's Honor Roll numerous times. When asked about his future, Enrique plans to pursue law school at Lewis & Clark once he finishes undergrad. He even found out that Andy's dad used to be a supreme court justice for Oregon and hopes to complete an internship in the next year. Enrique acknowledges the hard work that he's put in over the years and recognizes the FriendsPDX program with its resources and connections for getting him where he is




